Whole School – 87.8%

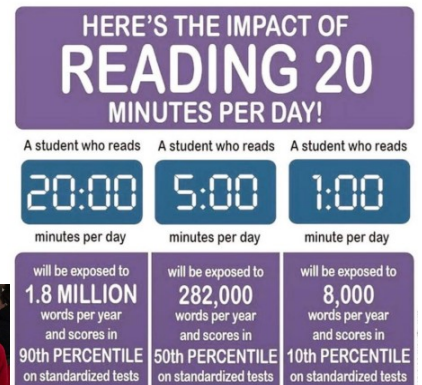
Highest House – Scotsman Green 89.2%

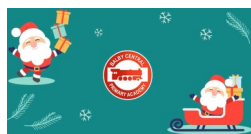
