### Safe

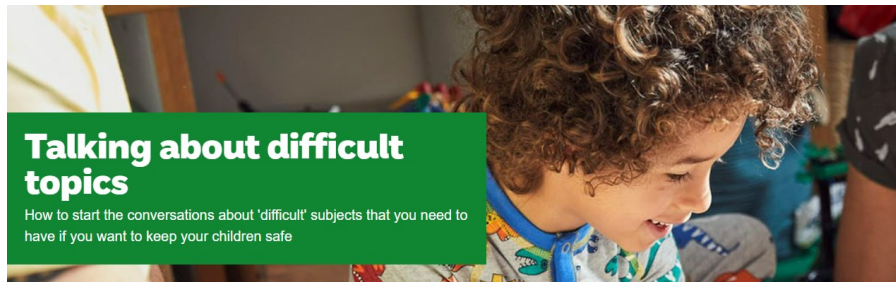
Follow the rules for health and safety for yourself and others.
