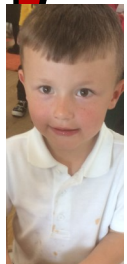

Attendance

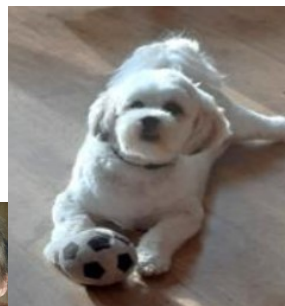


Whole School - 94.8%
