Safeguarding Assembly

Key Stage 1: This week our KS1 children listened to the Pantasorous story that will help children understand the importance of privacy, care and consent.

Talk to your child: what did they learn through watching the video?

Key Stage 2: This week, children have been building on the previous week's assembly, this is thinking about why stereotypes can be harmful. They have learned about bias and why it is important that we don't make judgements about people based on the way they look.

Talk to your child: can we tell what someone is like by looking at them and what do we assume about people?
