Safeguarding Assembly

Key Stage 1: This week our safeguarding assembly looked at what someone can do if things are not OK at home and they are worried about how they are being treated. Children understand that they can talk to a trusted adult and that there are different things that can be done to help and support them. **Talk to your child:** who are their trusted adults?

Key Stage 2: This week children have been using their knowledge of what race and racism is to challenge myth and stereotypes. They have started to think about what these words mean and why we need to know about them. **Talk to your child:** what is race and what is racism?

Reading at Balby Central

We have had 432 reads in school this week. This week, the children were set a challenge to read at least twice meaning that we could collect in excess of 800 reads. Let's try again next week! In first place this week for reads at home - well done Purple Class with 85 reads.
